Local man catches grand slam

CLEVELAND—A day at the ballpark became a memory of a lifetime for two local men.

Matt Coleman and Patrick Stever, both of Tiffin, attended game five of the American League Divisional Series at Progressive Field Saturday,

Oct. 12, but watching the Cleveland Guardians clinch the series proved not to be the highlight of the day.

In the fifth inning, Guardians player Lane Thomas hit what was arguably the biggest hit of the team's season, a grand slam, launching the ball 396 feet into the glove of fan Matt Coleman.

Coleman's catch didn't stop

Steyer celebrated at Saturday's game.

He turned and handed the prize ball to Steyer, another lifetime Guardians fan and his second cousin.

"It was really touching," Steyer said.

Coleman said the family shares season tickets to the Guardians, but health struggles have kept Steyer from taking part in the baseball tradition in recent years.

In 2022, Coleman said, Steyer was diagnosed with Leukemia, and the disease and treatment left him unable to make the Cleveland trip.

Coleman said he promised Steyer, "when you get well enough" they would attend a Guardians game together.

Saturday, he said, was "the perfect opportunity," with Steyer finally being strong enough to travel and the weather being ideal.

"It was a gift from God," Coleman said.

Coleman reflected on Steyer's journey through challenging circumstances and the light with which he lives.

Not only is Steyer battling Leukemia, but he also has Down Syndrome, and Coleman said he lives with a positivity and perseverance that make time with him a gift in itself.

Steyer's life is full of
advocacy for those
with developmental
disabilities and
genuine joy,
Coleman said.

Coleman said his dad, LeRoy, who passed away in 2017, lived with a similar set of principles as Steyer and was a pillar of faith and family.

"He (Patrick) embodies everything of my dad," he said.

Coleman said he imagines his dad was looking down on Saturday's game, the grand slam and Steyer's excitement at receiving the ball.


Coleman said he hopes Steyer will have the opportunity to meet the Guardians' Lane Thomas someday, and he will be "trying to get Patrick back up there" for future games.

In the meantime, Coleman said he hopes God "will keep using me" in the sharing of his time, talent and treasure, as a husband, father, Calvert's head baseball coach, and in his position as Student and Family Support Specialist at Calvert Catholic Schools.

You "never know" who you could reach, he said.

As for Steyer, he will always have an "October to remember" from 2024.

"It was a great day," he said.

#### Common giving scams and how to spot them

Phishing emails are one charity scam individuals must learn to recognize, particularly during the giving season.

November and December are the season of giving, and that charitable spirit is evidenced by the uptick in donations over the final months of the year. Perhaps inspired by Giving Tuesday, which is celebrated annually on the first Tuesday after Thanksgiving, donors tend to be especially generous in December. According to Donorbox, which provides an online fundraising platform to facilitate charitable donations, 31 percent of yearly charitable giving happens in December.

Nonprofit organizations undoubtedly recognize the spirit of generosity that surfaces each November and December, but criminals are likely cognizant of individuals' desire to give back during the holiday season as well. Indeed, a 2023 press release from the United States Attorney's Office in the Western District of North Carolina cited fake charities as one of the most common scams encountered by consumers during the holiday season. With that

in mind, it is encouraged to do research before donating this season.

- Fraudulent charities: Criminals targeting people who want to donate during the holiday season may set up fraudulent charities in an effort to trick people into giving them money. The New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs notes that fraudulent charities may feature impressive names or a name similar to one used by a reputable, well-known charity.
- Phishing emails: Phishing emails have been around for decades, and for good reason. Such scams are easy to implement and highly successful. The Federal Trade Commission reported receiving 358,000 reports of scammers contacting individuals via email in 2023, and the real number is likely much higher, as few consumers take the time to report such emails to the FTC. Phishing emails typically prompt recipients to click on a link embedded in an email. These emails may seem as though they're coming from an individual's bank or credit card company, while others may indicate

recipients can win a prize if they open the email and click on a link within it. The New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs warns consumers against sharing their credit card information in an email, even if the sender claims to be from a reputable charity.

- Pressure tactics: Seeking to capitalize on the spirit of giving that surfaces near the end of each year, some scammers will pressure prospective donors and potential victims into making donations over the phone or via links embedded in an email. Reputable charities do not pressure donors into giving over the phone or via email, so solicitations for immediate donations are a telltale sign of a charity scam. If prompted to make donations with cash or via gift cards or wire transfers, hang up the phone, as the FTC notes such payment methods are how scammers request donations.
- Thank you messages: Another common giving scam is to thank potential victims for past donations they never made. This is an attempt to trick generous individuals into thinking they have a past relationship with a charity they believe is reputable, which might make them less inclined to vet the person or organization thanking them. Scammers are banking on establishing that false sense of security and trust, particularly during a notably busy time of year when donors may feel as though they don't have the time to research organizations they want to support.

Scammers prey on individuals' generosity each holiday season. Many local, charitable organizations depend on your donations – so please donate as you can but first, ensure you are giving to a reputable cause. More information about giving scams and how to avoid them is available at consumer.ftc.gov.
