Grab a paddle PICKLEBALL OPTIONS

APLENTY IN THE 419

It's among the fastest growing sports and can be enjoyed by those young and old.

There are many places across the 419 area code where people can play. This includes the Firelands Region — Erie. Huron and Ottawa counties. Here's a look at just some of the places

where people can compete:



Coming soon, several siblings — Bobbie Bero, Jill Stephenson, Jodie Gulas and Phil Stephenson — will open what's known as The BackYard, an indoor pickleball facility and social

The new 20,000-square-foot facility is currently under construction at 355 Bridge Road, off Ohio 269 near Bergman Orchards, with plans to open sometime in 2025.

In addition to six indoor pickleball courts, there will be golf simulators, an outdoor space for activities, a self-service beer tap wall, a pro shop and a concession area with drinks and light food offerings.

They plan to have memberships for more frequent players.

MILAN

In 2023, Milan Township trustees pursued a major makeover to its tennis courts at Edison Park. 6 East St. Milan.

When crews completed a resurfacing project, they placed two new outdoor pickleball courts on pre-existing tennis courts.

The courts are open to public use so long as another user — such as Edison High School's tennis teams - aren't using this facility.

HURON

Osborn MetroPark, 3910 E. Perkins Ave., Huron, represents one of the more popular places to play pick-up pickleball games.

There are 10 outdoor courts with permanent lines and nets. People can play there and/or compete with those belonging to the Firelands Area Pickleball Association.

NORWALK

In 2024, Norwalk's government pursued a project at Jaycees Bicentennial Park on Pleasant Street in Norwalk where people can play pickleball.

There are now eight spaces fully dedicated to pickleball.

SANDUSKY

During the wintertime, the Cedar Point Sports Center, 2701 Cleveland Road (U.S. 6), Sandusky, also allows people to come inside and play pickleball.

The Firelands Area Pickleball Association helps coordinate this activity at the sports center. People can visit pickleheads.com/courts/us/ohio/ huron/osborn-metro-park for more information.

Drive a little further south and there's even more spaces to enjoy.

TIFFIN

Pickleball is growing nationwide in popularity, and Tiffin is keeping up with the trend.

Bryce Kuhn, parks director for the city of Tiffin, said for many years tennis courts were the dominant feature at local parks and schools, but the increasing interest in pickleball prompted a transition in recent years.

In 2017, he said, the courts at Hedges-Boyer Park, 491 Coe St., were modified from all tennis courts to two pickleball courts and one tennis court.

In 2024, Kuhn said, those courts were fully redeveloped, with the old courts being ripped out and a whole new base being installed to current standards.

The project widened and expanded the space in between the courts, and included installing fencing to help make the court experience more user friendly, he said.

A handicap-accessible parking spot also was added, he said, and the courts have lighting for those wishing to play past dark.

The overhaul of the courts was in response to the growing popularity of the sport, Kuhn said, ensuring Tiffin has modern options for players.

"It's the fad right now," he said.

In addition to the courts at Hedges-Boyer, Kuhn said the 2024 project also included a collaboration between the City of Tiffin and Tiffin University to address work needed on the courts at TU, 155 Miami St.

Thanks to a grant from a local foundation, Kuhn said, a sixth court lined for two pickleball courts was added at TU.

The addition allows "true tournaments" to take place at the facility, he said, and also are open to community use.

Last summer, Kuhn said the annual youth tennis camp at Tiffin University included pickleball lessons, in addition to tennis instruction, for the first time.

"The feedback was awesome," he said.

Kuhn said Heidelberg University lined its tennis courts for pickleball in 2023, and those also are open to the public. Those courts are located on the Heidelberg campus near Talmage Hall.

Use of the courts at the park and both universities is first-come, first-serve, he said, and Kuhn said he is aware of at least two pickleball leagues in the community.

FINDLAY

As pickleball's popularity has taken over the nation, residents in Findlay have taken up the game in droves.

A movement spearheaded by Jon Pritchard in 1965, Pritchard's game that he invented in his backyard grew into 8.9 million people playing his game pickleball, Ohio Cooperative Living reports.

Findlay residents Dick and Greta Schrock started their journey in 2011 when they took lessons from Nancy and Dick Heebsh, and they instantly fell in love with the sport.

"It was something that we could play together as we started approaching retirement," Dick Schrock said.

After Dick and Greta started their journey in 2011, their passion for the sport turned into a mentor role and they began giving lessons





to the people of Findlay. Findlay's Flag City Pickleball Club started in 2009, and now has over 200 members.

"As unofficial ambassadors of pickleball in Findlay, we love to teach others how to play the sport," Dick said. "Since June, we have already taught over 60 people ranging in age from 10 to 80 and have six more

Tuesday Training times left this summer for those who want to learn."

Pickleball is something like a combination of ping pong and tennis, with one or two players to a team. Unlike tennis, you can only score a point from winning a rally as the serving team. If the serving team doesn't win the rally, the serve will go to the other team, who can try to score a point. Games go to 11 and players have to win by two or more points, though tournament games can be played to 15 or 21 with the same rules above being applied.

Dick and Greta's success with getting people to come to lessons comes from the game's lighthearted nature, Dick said.

"Pickleball is a very social sport and is played by people of all ages. If you show up at a pickleball court, people will ask you to play and

someone will give you a paddle if you don't have one. There is fun and laughter and everyone can play," he said.

Dick and Greta said just about everyone should go out and give it a try.

"Do you want to have some exercise, make lots of new friends and have a blast doing it? Then come out and try pickleball," Dick said. "You'll be glad you did, just like the millions of other new players who have tried it"

Canine friends have plenty of spaces to enjoy

Summer vacation isn't just for the humans.

A number of spacious dog parks are available for four-legged friends to roam, run and play with owners and other animals.

Here's an overview of a few of the parks available to visit:

K-9 FIELD OF DREAMS DOG PARK

16618 Township Rd 208, Findlay

K-9 Field of Dreams Dog Park, about 1½ miles east of Findlay at Riverbend Recreation Area, gives dogs a safe area to run free.

The one-acre dog park has separate areas for large dogs and smaller ones (30 pounds or less). Each section has a shade shelter, picnic tables and water pump with a spigot. The dog park is located south of Ohio 568. To find it: turn south off of Ohio 568 onto Township Road 241, cross the Blanchard River, then turn left

Another dog park option in the 419 is the Erie MetroBark Park, located at 3109 Hull Road, Huron, in Erie County.

onto Township Road 208 to enter Riverbend Recreation Area; Township Road 208 bends sharply right, winding around the dog park; turn right to enter a parking lot just south of the dog park.

On one recent afternoon, tongue dangling from her mouth, Cinder, a year-old black Rottweiler mix, jumped and skipped excitedly around Hannah Mueller as they walked into the dog park recently.

"We come here pretty frequently," Mueller said.

"I don't really have a yard to let her run in, so it's nice to just let her run and not have to worry about her escaping anywhere," she said.

Sox, a yellow Pitbull-Boxer-Great Pyrenees mix, flashed a toothy smile, ears flapped back and tail in the air, as he ran through the park.

Neomi Watkins frequently brings the 5-month-old pooch as well as Reaper, a 2-year-old Chihuahua-Dachshund mix.

"We don't have that big of a yard, so it gives this one (Sox) a chance to run without going all over the neighborhood," Watkins said. "It gives him a chance to run."

The park has rules for the benefit of everyone:

- Dogs must be legally licensed, vaccinated, and wear dog tags.
- Refrain from using the park when dogs are in heat.
- Clean up dog feces and deposit in the concrete tank; a claw tool is available to help with disposal of waste.
- Remove aggressive dogs from the park.
- Only dogs 30 pounds and under are permitted in the small dog side.
- Refrain from bringing puppies less than 4 months of age.
- Control dogs with voice or leash at all times.
- Accompany and closely supervise children under the age of 16.
- Bring no more than two dogs at one time.
- Lead by example. Take it upon yourself to do the right thing.



- Test your dog's socialization skills off-leash with other dogs.
- Introduce your dog to new dogs only when your dog is comfortable and behaving appropriately.
- Choose a non-busy time to visit for the first few visits.
 Typically, weekends and after work are the busiest times.
- Obedience classes can help improve your dog's socialization skills with other dogs. Puppy classes for dogs 8 to 16 weeks old can help with early socialization skills.
- The first visit to the dog park can be very stressful. Keep the visits short, gradually working toward longer visits.
- Don't expect too much from your dog. Remember to go at the dog's pace.

The Tiffin Bark Park is a 1.5-acre off-leash facility that's open 24/7, 365 days a year—thanks to the 2022 installation of 14 solar-powered lights. The park consists of A fenced-in grassy areas with agility equipment, a hill tunnel, two pavilions for shade, and designated spaces for both large and small or senior dogs.

With benches, water bowls, toys, and waste stations throughout, the park is designed with both canine and human comfort in mind. Maintained by the nonprofit Friends of the Tiffin Bark Park, Inc., the park utilizies a key fob entry system and security cameras to ensure safety and controlled access.

To use the park, dogs must be registered, which includes providing veterinary proof of current vaccinations such as Rabies, DH(L)PP, and Bordetella, along with a recent fecal test. Once approved, owners receive an electronic fob for entry—\$10 for the key, plus \$10 per year of use.



When it comes to the 419 area, there are many must-see landmarks. brimming with historical detail and regional intrigue. From the remnants of American wars to historic bridges to places where cultures from the past edge into the present, the area offers dozens of daytrip experiences chock-full of stories that will stick with you long into the

THOMAS EDISON BIRTHPLACE **MUSEUM**

Milan

For those wanting to know about the early life of famous inventor Thomas Edison, a visit to his childhood home in Milan is in order.

Edison, famous for inventions including the phonograph, motion

Edison Museum

picture camera and early versions of the incandescent light bulb, was born in Milan on Feb. 11, 1847. He lived there until the family moved to Michigan in 1854.

The museum arounds include the birthplace home. A tour of the home is hosted by expert guides who share fascinating stories about his childhood and family.

Also at the site is the Don Gfell education center. There you can, "learn

about Edison's inventions, the science behind his innovations and the impact of his work on the modern world," according to the museum's website.

There is also a gift shop selling many Edison-related items, books and memorabilia.

The museum opened for the 2025 season in February. Beginning in May it is open Thursday through Saturday, noon to 5 p.m., and Sunday, 1 to 5 p.m.

Additional hours are available on their website tomedison.org.

They are closed on Easter, Independence Day, Labor Day weekend, Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve and Christmas day.

Children under 5 are free. Children from 5 to 18 are \$12. Adults are \$17. There are discounts available for seniors as well as special family rates. Active duty military members with ID are free.

PERRY'S VICTORY AND INTERNATIONAL PEACE MEMORIAL

Put-in-Bay

Commemorating America's Battle of Lake Erie victory during the War of 1812, Perry's Victory and International Peace Memorial features a 352foot tower. It was built between the 1912 centennial of the war and 1915.

The site also includes a visitor center and it is administered by the National Park Service.

The memorial is situated in Put-in-Bay on South Bass Island, near where the battle took place.

On Sept. 10, 1813, a squadron of ships commanded by Oliver Hazard Perry of the U.S. Navy caught and engaged ships of the United Kingdom's navy just north of South Bass Island.

During an intense battle, Perry's flagship, the Lawrence, was reduced to a wreck and he transferred his command to the Niagara.

Before leaving Lawrence, Perry struck his personal pennant bearing the motto, "Don't give up the ship." Replicas of this pennant are now seen at many homes and businesses in the area.

After accepting the British surrender, Perry

Tickets for the tower's observation deck are available the day of a visit and must be purchased at the visitor center.

The tickets have a time so there is no waiting in line, according to the National Park Service.

Those with annual park passes. which cost \$35, are admitted to the observation deck for free. Holders of the NPS's America the Beautiful pass, which costs at most \$80. are admitted for free.

The park also features a visitor center. It features a 15-minute video about Battle of Lake Erie, a sculpture of Oliver Hazard Perry and a gift shop.

The memorial is open May 17 through September 7 from 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. daily.



GILBOA BULL

Gilboa

Along the 1,132 miles of roads and highways that crisscross Putnam County, visitors will find places to drink wine and listen to jazz, one of the best inland places to scuba dive in Northwest Ohio and a castle like swimming pool that's listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

But it could be a giant, fiberglass, brown-and-white bull that has become the county's most visible attraction, standing at the edge of the tiny town of Gilboa.

Peter Diller brought the 16-foot-tall, 1,500-pound bull to town in the mid 1970s. According to his son, who is also Peter Diller, his dad was on his way to Tony Packo's in Toledo when he saw the giant figure behind an old bar along the river.

At the time, Gilboa was undergoing a revitalization with a restaurant and stores locating in the small town.

The elder Diller knew the bull would be a real eye-catcher so he talked to the owner of the bar about buying the statue and negotiated a price of \$1.800.

Diller's sons went to pick up the bull with a semi and drop-deck trailer. A forklift was used to pick the statue up by its belly, and it was loaded on the trailer with its head hanging over the cab of the truck.

The brothers thought it would be an easy trip to get on Interstate 75 to get back to Gilboa.

But at the first intersection, the bull's head rammed into the stoplight. At every stoplight after that until they reached the interstate, one brother would have to jump out and stop traffic while the bull made its way around the light.



Once the statue arrived in Gilboa, the bull was placed on town property at the corner of U.S. 224 and Pearl Street, beside the village park. The bull was not immediately anchored down and pranksters tipped it over three or four times.

Eventually, they cemented it into the ground.

Since then, the bull has become a mascot for the village and a favorite backdrop for wedding photos.

SCHUMACHER HOMESTEAD

The Swiss Homestead near Bluffton, sometimes called the Schumacher House, offers a glimpse into the lives of Swiss immigrants in portions of Allen and Putnam counties known as the Settlement during the mid-19th century.

Christian and Barbara Schumacher built their two-story wooden home at 8350 Bixel Road after immigrating from Switzerland in 1843.

The Schumachers and their four children lived in a log house on the property for the first several years before a three-bay, timber-frame house was built using local materials. Its inside walls were insulated using mud and straw. The cellar features stone guarried from the nearby creek.

Son Peter Schumacher married Elizabeth Suter in 1839 and raised 16 children at the farm; each grew to adulthood, married and had an average of 10 children, giving Peter and Elizabeth 163 grandchildren and 452 great-grandchildren.

The home would pass through generations of Schumachers and other families and finally renters, until it was purchased by the Swiss Community Historical Society which had been founded in the 1950s to honor and preserve the heritage of the Bluffton-Pandora community. A museum restoration begun in 2005 resulted in a complete remodel of the house to its original look.

The area was called a Swiss settlement and included both Swiss Reformed, who located in the southern part of the area; and Swiss Mennonites who settled in the northern part, mostly in Putnam County.

Tours and special events now offer visitors the chance to see what life would have been like for the Schumacher family.

More recently, the society is nearly finished converting a timber frame barn built by Swiss settlers into a new Heritage Center. The 40-by-80-foot barn was previously located on the Dan and Cindy Basinger Farm. The structure was moved to the homestead and in 2022 dismantled by a crew from JCM Timberworks in Killbuck. Workers salvaged every timber they could to repurpose in the new center.

The barn has been reassembled between the farmhouse and bank barn and will provide heated and air-conditioned facilities for events, artifact displays, workshop area, a children's room, fiber room, restrooms and storage space.

It was the start of the Civil War, and both Ohio and Hancock County

played significant roles in the struggle that followed 164 years ago.

Four regiment members from Hancock County participated in the

famous Andrews' Raid which penetrated the southern lines in northern Georgia and seized a Confederate locomotive and train in an attempt to interrupt communications and transportation.

The men were chased down before they reached Chattanooga, Tennessee, and the Raiders jumped from the train and ran into the woods. Within a week, all 22 were captured. Eight were executed, eight escaped and six were exchanged for Confederate prisoners.

The four Raiders from Hancock County were John Scott, John Reed Porter, Wilson Brown and William Bensinger. Porter

Porter and Bensinger are buried in Union Cemetery, 606-614 W. Main St., McComb.

The Raiders also received the nation's first Medals of Honor for their bravery. Bensinger's medal plus another one designed in subsequent years are on permanent display at the McComb Public Library, 113 S. Todd St.

BASILICA AND NATIONAL SHRINE OF OUR LADY OF CONSOLATION

Every August, Our Lady of Consolation in Carey takes part in the Catholic tradition of novena involving nine days of prayer. Built in 1824, the Old Mission Church was the first Methodist Episcopal Church in America, according to John Stewart United Methodist Church, the organization that manages and maintains the historical site.

The building cost just a little over a thousand dollars to build and was paid for with federal funds.

Members of the Wyandotte Native American tribe worshipped at the church until 1843, when they were forced to move west to reservations after the passing of the Indian Removal Act of 1830.

Old Mission Church celebrated its 200th anniversary of the building in 2024 and was added to the National Registry of Historic Places in 1976.



BEACHES IN THE 419

Waterside spots to visit this summer

You don't need to go to the East or West Coast to hit the beach this summer

There are plenty of spots to lounge and swim in the water in this neck of Ohio.

If you do, take heed of the potential dangers of swimming in various bodies of water — including checking water monitoring agencies for <u>cleanliness and if the area has lifeguards available.</u>

Here's a handful of spots you can visit:

WHITE STAR QUARRY

925 S. Main St., Gibsonburg

The White Star Quarry, located in Gibsonburg, offers beachgoers an oasis of crystal clear, bright blue water in the 419 area code.

Christina Warden, administrative supervisor and human resource coordinator for the Sandusky County Park District, said the swim

beach is small - only about 300 feet across - but makes a good day destination for families. Warden said there are always certified lifeguards on duty during swimming hours, a small concession stand for snacks and no alcohol is permitted on the beach.

White Star Quarry is within the boundaries of White Star Park in Sandusky County. The 800-acre park is also regularly patrolled, Warden said.

White Star was a quarry

operation that mined limestone. It was developed with Federal Land & Water Conservation Fund money and the sale of scrap metal from the site. The White Star Quarry is the location of White Star Quarry Beach, scuba diving, shelter rentals, fishing opportunities, boating (only hand-powered and electric motors are allowed), and an .8-mile trail that circles the quarry.

The quarry is a 15-acre lake with an average depth of 40 feet. The center of the quarry approaches 50 feet. There are two "holes": one near the wall close to the main diving entrance and the other at the bottom of a stone crusher that are 60 feet and 80 feet, respectively.

Warden said the park is a popular destination for scuba divers.

HARRISON LAKE STATE PARK

26246 Harrison Lake Road, Fayette

Harrison Lake State Park is a good destination for outdoor enthusiasts and history buffs who'd like a place to take the whole family - including the dog - for a swim to cool off during a day of summertime activities.

In 1941, a dam over Mill Creek was completed, and Harrison Lake was created. The lake and surrounding area were maintained primarily for hunting and fishing purposes until 1950, when Harrison Lake was established as a state park.

The area comprising Harrison Lake State Park was at one time part

of a vast wetland.
The park still harbors
unique natural features
associated with
wetlands. Great blue
herons, common egrets,
songbirds, several
species of reptiles
and amphibians and
small mammals can be
sighted at the park.

The park features

camping, with pets permitted on all sites, boating, fishing, picnicking, hiking, disc golf and more.

The main swim beach is 150 feet long. A designated "dog swim area" is located near the camparound, west of the main swimming beach.

"Because the lake is smaller and shallower, it tends to warm quicker in the season and be warmer than larger bodies of water with beaches," said Donald Gurzynski, park manager. "Due to the bank height and trees surrounding the lake, the water's surface is not as affected by weather conditions and remains calmer on blustery days."

Due to the lake's remote location, Gurzynski said park visitors often can find themselves alone on the beach on a weekday.

"Almost as if you were on your own private beach," he said.

East Harbor State Park provides public access to the beaches of Lake Erie.

The park features a 1,500-foot sand beach on Lake Erie. Swimming is permitted in designated areas. Other amenities include modern restrooms, changing rooms, outdoor showers and vending machines. Dogs are not permitted on the swim beach.

"There are not many beaches along the Lake Erie shore that are open to the public. The beach at East Harbor has a nice, gradual slope and is protected by four breakwaters," said Mike Monnet, parks and watercraft manager. "You can wade out there a long way, and the water will still only be waist high."

Monnet said the calm water makes it a good location for families with children and seniors.







He said people visit the park on foot, by car, bike, or boat.

East Harbor is situated on a peninsula stretching into the waters of Lake Erie. The park also lies on the fringe of Ohio's prairie marsh zone. These wetlands are remnants of the Great Black Swamp, which once covered an area 120 miles long and 30-40 miles wide.

Nature enthusiasts enjoy viewing an abundance of waterfowl and shorebirds in the park's scenic wetlands, as well as from the swimming beach and picnic areas along the lake. East Harbor also offers a large campground and boating, hiking and fishing amenities.

CEDAR POINT BEACH

Cedar Point, Sandusky

You know about the roller coasters and the rides at Cedar Point, but the beach also is a major attraction.

The mile-long beach is a private beach, but it's included with park admission and season passes and is one of the perks for overnight visitors staying at Hotel Breakers.



Cedar Point Beach

The offerings at the beach include the Hotel Breakers Beach Club. which offers activities such as beach volleyball and cocktails at the Sand Bar. There are also "beach bungalows," partially shaded areas with chairs and a couch, a coffee table, a fire pit and food and beverage service, and boardwalk cruiser tours by pedicab. Jet ski rentals also are available.

NICKEL PLATE BEACH

1 Nickel Plate Drive, Huron

Nickel Plate Beach, located at 1 Nickel Plate Drive in Huron, is known for having a particularly large sandy beach that provides a view of the Huron Lighthouse. It features picnic shelters and tables, grills, a play area for kids, a ping pong table (bring your own paddles and balls). corn hole boards (bring your own balls) and beach volleyball courts (bring your own play equipment).

Paddle boarding, kayaking and beach gear rentals are available at the Paddle Shack. Paddle Shack also rents group games such as Spikeball, Kan-Jam, Ladder Golf, Giant Yard Pong, beach darts and sports balls.

Beach hours are 11 a.m. to 6 p.m., Memorial Day through Labor Day. No lifeguard is available, so swim at your own risk and beware of dangerous currents. There's a \$7 daily parking fee per vehicle, with season parking passes available from the City of Huron for frequent

Dogs are banned at the beach. Portable restrooms are available.

VERMILION MAIN STREET BEACH

400-469 Main St., Vermilion

Vermilion Main Street Beach is located in downtown Vermilion. The beach features a kayak/canoe launch, benches, an ADA mobility mat, a restroom and a concession stand. View the beach from a webcam at www.discoververmilion.org.

Notice also that visiting the beach puts you in the middle of Vermilion, a pleasant small city that's very walkable and has good dining and shopping options.

WATERWORKS PARK

Near Ohio 163 heading west to downtown Port Clinton

Port Clinton City Beach, located near downtown Port Clinton off of East Perry Street (e.g., Ohio 163), offers a sandy beach, a playground, picnic tables, a basketball court, picnic tables, charcoal grills and restrooms. You can bring your pet, too, if the animal is on a leash. Your visit to the beach also provides easy access to shopping and dining in the city's walkable downtown area.

GILBOA QUARRY

3763 Old State Route 224, Ottawa

Gilboa Quarry, with its clear, spring-fed waters, has been known for its diving opportunities for many years.

Within the last few years, non-divers were given a space to call their own in the form of a small, quarry-side beach on which people can do nearly anything that can be done on nearly any other waterside, sandy

"It's a nice little area," manager Chevenne Klausing said, "I wouldn't say it's huge, but I wouldn't say it's entirely super small. It's a nice little space."

The quarry, which bills itself on its website, www.gilboaquarry.com, as "the premier Midwest destination for divers of all levels, freedivers and snorkelers," features a number of fish and underwater attractions that have been installed, such as replicas of an



airplane, a helicopter and even a school bus.

Now, too, there's something for those who prefer shallower waters and relaxation in the sun.

"It's all one area," Klausing said. "We have different areas of entry for the scuba area, but then we have our beach part that is also connected to the quarry and is another entry point to the water. It's kind of, like, for families who are looking to hang out while their spouse is diving or their children are diving. They just kind of hang out on the beach and wait for

Mike Williams, who opened the guarry in 1990, sold it in 2021 to Full Tank, LLC, which is based in Pequot Lakes, Minnesota. It is open yearround, though it will be "in season" on May 16 through mid-October.

"I start using the beach as soon as the weather gets nice," Klausing said. "It like to kind of lay out there. After work, I'll go paddleboarding. It just depends really, on the weather, but when we start getting nice days, we'll start seeing people using the beach. My mom loves to come out; she brings my aunt and they'll hang out."

Klausing said many people bring "floaties" to use in the water, and paddleboards and kayaks may be rented.

She added that the fun isn't limited to humans.

"My dog loves to play at the beach," she said. "It's her favorite spot. She likes to pounce on all the fish down there."

She added: "It's quite nice. The water is crystal-clear, too. And it's very warm. The water gets up to, like, high 70s in the summer. It's like bathwater."

THE LOCKPORT COVERED BRIDGE

The Lockport Bridge is almost entirely made of wood. There are no steel beams supporting the bridge and the few non-wood components of the bridge include a lightweight concrete deck supported by wooden structural members, a tin roof covering the pedestrian walkway on the bridge's south side, concrete abutments and a few steel tension wires.

The completed bridge opened to traffic on June 19, 1999. The Lockport Bridge differs little from historic covered bridges except for its size. It meets modern bridge requirements by being large enough and strong enough to allow a semi truck to pass through the span.

The Lockport Covered Bridge is about 5 miles west of Sauder Village and north of Stryker, near the Goll Woods Nature Preserve.

FORT MEIGS

Visitors can get a taste of the War of 1812 at Fort Meigs, which was constructed in 1813 under the direction of General William Henry Harrison, who would go on to become the ninth president of the United States. Fort Meigs is known as the largest reconstructed, wooden-walled fortification. The fort withstood two attacks by the British during the War of 1812. The fort was rebuilt in 2003, with a new visitor center and museum added. In addition to the 3,000-square-foot museum, the building includes a store and classrooms that are available for rent. Four interactive, blockhouse exhibits detail the history of the fort, and interpreters dressed in War of 1812 uniforms conduct daily musket demonstrations and talks throughout the summer. The fort hosts reenactments May through August.

OLANDER PARK

Olander Park does not lack for things to do.

And among them is the availability of a manmade lake with a beach that lies in wait for the season to open on Memorial Day weekend.

The beach sits alongside Olander Lake, which covers about 28 of the park's 60 acres. As well as supplying a place for sun worshipers and recreational swimming, the lake may be traversed by paddleboat or kayak and be of service to those aiming to catch fish.

The beach will be open on Wednesdays through Sundays during the season, with admission priced at \$5 for those who live in the Sylvania school district and \$7 for those who reside outside the district. Youngsters age 2 and under are admitted free.

Erika Buri, executive director of Outdoor Sylvania Community Parks, said buoys separate swimmers and boaters and lifeguards are on duty at all times.

"There's never any time when we aren't paying attention," Buri said. "We have a shallow area and then we also have kind of a cordoned-off tot area, so if you have little ones, we have a great place for them to swim where they cannot physically get into deeper water. That's a really great feature.

"There are some really nice shelters and picnic tables on the beach. The lake is spring-fed, so it's extremely clean and we get it tested each week with the health department. Our numbers are always super low, so it's a great lake to go swimming in."

The lake, which was formed from a quarry that closed in the mid-1950s, has been available to swimmers for more than 30 years, Buri said.

"Interestingly, we actually get more folks from outside the Sylvania school district who are swimming than we do residents because, I

think, the city has a lot of options. There are several country clubs and there's a swimming quarry at another pool that's owned by the Sylvania recreation program, and the YMCA is right down the street and its pool is pretty busy in the summer.

"But we have pretty good attendance -enough to still justify having it open, but it's not super packed, usually."

Olander Park

Indeed, Olander Park offers playgrounds for youngsters, sand volleyball and other activities.

"Olander has the advantage of having really nice walking trails," Buri said. "... You could come and just spend the whole day at the park and go swimming and walk around and have a picnic and it would be just a great day out and about. If I didn't work here — and even sometimes because I do — it would be a great way to just spend the day outdoors with my family."

Those fishing on Lake Olander must be licensed and are required to abide by state laws.

"It is great for fishing, so that's a whole other reason to just come and spend the day at Olander Park," Buri said. "There are just so many options beyond swimming for things to do. It's kind of a gem. A lot of people don't know about it, and we try to keep it affordable so folks can come out and spend the day and enjoy the water, and I would love for folks to come out and explore."



7417 Co. Hwy 47, Upper Sandusky

Located on the banks of the Sandusky River about a mile and a half north of Upper Sandusky, the former gristmill once owned by the Wyandotte Nation of American Indians now houses a museum of Wyandot heritage and milling history. The original sawmill and dam were built in 1819 with a gristmill added the following year, primarily as a reward for the Wyandotte Indians siding with the U.S. government in the War of 1812. The Wyandottes had their grain and lumber milled there for free.

Both mills were located 300 feet upstream from the current site.

The mill - located 4 miles north of Upper Sandusky off Ohio 67 North on County Highway 37 - is open the first weekend in May through the end of October. Hours are 1-4:30 p.m. Friday through Sunday.



283 Ohio 53 North, McCutchenville

The McCutchen Overland Inn Museum at 283 Ohio 53 North, was dedicated as a stagecoach museum in 1967.

The original log cabin was built in 1829 by Col. Joseph McCutchen and was used as a hotel and later a stagecoach stop on the Harrison Trail. This passage was formerly an Indian Trail that extended from the Scioto River in Columbus north to Lake Erie.

The building, which was restored and furnished with antiques from the stagecoach era, was dedicated as the restored Overland Inn in 1967.

Museum hours are 1-4:30 p.m. Saturday and Sunday and weekdays by appointment. For tour information, contact the Wyandot County Historical Society at 419-294-3857 or email wycohs@sbcglobal.net.




