Author sends original work for safekeeping

Visiting the Mazza Museum many years ago as a speaker, best-selling author, journalist, and poet Nikki Grimes was impacted by the place and expressed her desire to bring her original illustrations to the museum at some point. She originally intended to bequest 12 original pieces to the museum as a part of her estate after her passing.

When the California wildfires spread quickly near her home recently, she decided to send the artwork to the museum early, to ensure its safety.

"A couple of Tuesdays ago when it

was below zero. I was in the office and received a phone call from Nikki, almost in tears," said Mazza Museum

Director Benjamin Sapp. "She said that

It is often said that everyone is Irish on St. Patrick's Day. That is because St. Patrick's Day has become a global celebration that is enjoyed by those of Irish descent as well as anyone who enjoys a good party. Although you don't have to be Irish to raise a pint or dig into some corned beef this March, there are plenty of people who can trace their lineage to the Emerald Isle, including some notable celebrities. Check out these individuals that you might not have known have some Irish roots, courtesy of Irish Star, Hollywood Ancestry, Carrolls Irish Gift Shop, and Business Insider.

- · Nicole Kidman: Though Kidman grew up in Australia, the Oscarwinning actress has Irish and Scottish ancestry. Her father's ancestors traveled to Australia as free settlers in 1839.
- Marilyn Monroe: This popular 1950s film star adopted mother's her maiden "Monroe" name when she began career. Monroe's acting maternal grandparents were midwesterners American of Irish descent. It is said Monroe stems from the Gaelic Munro clan.

- · Barack Obama: In 2007, Barack Obama was a presidential-hopeful and found out his great-greatgrandfather Flamouth Kearney traveled from Ireland to America by way of Liverpool in 1850, giving the former president some Irish heritage.
- · George Clooney: With a last name like Clooney, it makes sense that the Academy Award winner has some Irish heritage in his background. His paternal great-great-grandparents Nicholas Clooney and Bridget Byron came to the United States from Ireland.
- · Anne Hathaway: The actress has said she has Irish ancestry through both parents and is believed to be more than 60 percent Irish. Her roots lie in counties Cork and Donegal.
- · Mariah Carey: This diva songstress has Irish ancestors on her mother's side. Hollywood Ancestry traces that Irish heritage to at least her third great-grandfather, John Blanchfield, who was born in Ireland around 1822. · Meryl Streep: This award-
- winning actress has greatgreat-grandparents who were from Nunfanaghy on the north coast of County Donegal. They emigrated to Pennsylvania sometime between 1864 and 1870.

on gifting us these 12 original works of art through her estate, but wanted to do it now because of the fires that were affecting so many people and homes in California. So we worked quickly to make it happen."

That same morning, Grimes removed the pieces from their frames, had them packed, and shipped them to Findlay. The museum is currently processing the pieces into its database before displaying them in upcoming exhibits. Gift"), Floyd Cooper ("Meet Danitra Brown"), Paul Morin ("At Break of Day"), Elizabeth Zunon ("Bedtime for Sweet Creatures"), E.B. Lewis ("Talkin' About Bessie," "Our Mothers, Our Fathers"), Wendell Minor ("Southwest Sunrise"), and Jerome Lagarrigue ("My Man Blue").

Sapp said he couldn't possibly pick a favorite from the collection.

"That's a question I get a lot and I don't know that I can truly answer that. I know each of these people who did the illustrations and they all are fabulous, originally after her passing, but now that can be done today and from this point forward."

When the pieces are officially put on display, visitors can view the artwork along with the books they're published in, providing guests with both the visual and literary aspects of the story.

The Mazza Museum is known for having the largest and most diverse selection of original picture book art on display. Grimes' addition will continue to expand the museum's collection and featured illustrators.

Although the original pieces will be at the museum, they will be duplicated to be included in Grimes' home as well.

"We will make high-quality prints and send those to her and they'll be the same size as the originals that she took out of the frames," said Sapp. "She'll be able to put these prints back in the frames and hang them wherever her home might be at any given time."

The collection includes illustrations from Grimes' books made by renowned artists, including father and son Jerry Pinkney and Brian Pinkney ("A Walk in the Woods"), Ashley Bryan ("Aneesa Lee and the Weaver's

wonderful people who are, in a sense, all favorites of mine and so many others in the world who read and share picture books with children. I don't think you could pick an actual favorite."

Sapp said the donation is important not only for its artistic value but what the pieces represent.

"Nikki will be able to see these works of art and hear about these works of art being used in educational ways with the 25,000+ visitors we have here each year," said Sapp. "She'll be able to know that they're being cared for and preserved. They will be used in the way she would hope they would be

"It's a place where people can come and see the highest quality of work that these illustrators are creating. It's also showing diversity in the work of illustrators and how they're sharing that diversity through their work in picture books," said Sapp. "I think there's a lot to be told. You could even sit down and read each of the books while the art is on display. Those stories then have so much more meaning and things to be shared within the cover to cover of each book."


